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1. Feedback Process

1.1 Feedback Collection

To get an overall idea on curriculum and other relevant aspects, the university has established feedback system through the close ended structured questionnaire via Google forms. Feedback is collected from stake holders which include students, alumni, employers and parents. Feedback is collected from the students on curriculum, teaching and learning twice in a year, it focuses on the course objectives, general observations, skill development, innovations and methodology, commitment and command & help and motivation. Students feedback on institutional facilities is collected once in a year which targets the overall facilities and ambience of the University. Feedback from recruiters, alumni and parents are taken once in year on curriculum development and overall improvement of teaching learning process. The feedback is collected through a questionnaire in a scale of 5. The feedback analysis committee of the University designs and collects feedback from its stakeholders to monitor and evaluate its performance quality on curriculum and curriculum related issues.

Feedback Analysis:

The data collected by the IQAC was sorted and consolidated for drafting the analysis report. The data entered in the selected format was then converted into chart form and decoded for the proper comprehension of the matter. The analysis is done year wise as well as parameter wise. The aspects pointed out by all the stakeholders are considered with special care and attention. The Feedback analysis committee discussed and evaluated the suggestions received from different spheres regarding the curriculum. The suggestions were consolidated to communicate to the respective University authorities for necessary action. Proper suggestions were formulated to be communicated to ensure the proper redressal of the grievances. The quantitative analysis is done on the basis of the score while the qualitative analysis is done on major opinions and suggestions given by different stakeholders.

7. Analysis of Feedback:

- Feedback on Student's access to research and development facilities of the School was moderate.
- Responses in regards learning ambience in hostel and staff was average.
- Feedback on student societies in context to their inviting ambiance, internet and medical services was moderate.
- Parents are overall satisfied; average response was on support services (Transport, Canteen etc.) and effectiveness of grievance redressal.
- Alumni responses was general; average response on their proficiency in technical areas, application of learning to solve complex issues, innovate, predict changes globally.
- Employers had average responses on technical, communication, and teamwork skills of the graduates. Further they had moderate responses on students' interest, creativity, reliability noted; workplace problem-solving capacity.

8. Corrective measures to be taken in the next academic year:

- School heads should communicate procedure to access school's research and development facilities to students. They also should take special initiative to enhance the proficiency level of students in their creativity, application of learning to solve complex issues and predict changes globally.
- Hostel administration should enhance the learning ambiance in hostel and staff should be counseled to be student friendly.
- Student/ Technical Societies should create an inviting atmosphere to accept student ideas.
- Grievance redressal procedures and its effectiveness should be properly communicated to students and parents by Grievance cells of the University.
- Training and Placement Cell should take more initiatives to enhance the technical, communication, workplace problem-solving capacity and improve teamwork skills of the graduates.
