Yes, KIIT has a Tutor Mentor Programme, in which each teacher has been allotted with a small group of students to enhance their all round development by ensuring an appropriate classroom environment, broadening curriculum participation and strengthening one to one bond between the students and the teachers. Mentors provide emotional as well as academic support, guidance, motivation, pose themselves as ideal role models for the mentees and also help them in their future career growth. Student mentorship has the following aims: To enhance teacher student contact hours To enhance students' academic performance and attendance To minimize student dropout rates To identify and understand the status of slow learners and encourage advanced learners To render equitable service to students With a wide variation in the student population in regard to educational and economic background, the system promises to provide a better understanding of individual students and bring out their highest potential. It also appears to be the most effective method for mitigating cases of those students who are vulnerable to dropout from studies. Design Implementation: The IQAC had taken the initiative of implementing the mentoring of students. Students are categorized based on the streams of studies and also according to their core subjects. They are divided into groups of 10 to 15 depending on the number of teachers and students available in a course. Each group is assigned a teacher mentor who would perform mentoring duties. A Mentoring Format with Guidelines prepared by the IQAC to ensure uniformity is available with each mentor. It is the practice of Mentors to meet students individually or in groups. In isolated cases parents are called for counselling/special meetings with the Principal at the suggestion of the Mentor. If a student is identified as having weakness in particular subject, it is the duty of the Mentor to apprise the concerned subject teacher. Uniqueness: The institutional practice of Mentoring System has been designed and implemented - to be student centric to render equitable service to students of varied academic financial backgrounds. The scheme is adapted for the value additions to the students like - a) Bridging the gap between the teachers and students. b) Creation of a better environment in college, where students can approach teachers for both educational and personal guidance. c) Enhancement of knowledge base for both teachers and students alike, due to effective two way communication. d) Awareness and support to students for GATE, GRE, CAT, ISRO, SAIL, GAIL, HAL, NTPC, BSNL, DRDO, BARC, and other Govt. PSUs examinations. e) Motivation for higher studies and entrepreneurship. f) Advice and support for improvement in academic performance.

KIIT has always initiated environment care and sustainable energy utilization in various forms and maintained with a clean and green environment. They are:

a) Solar power generation and utilization b) Bio gas production from Organic waste c) Solar Thermal Utilities d) Ground water recharge from Rainwater (
Recycled Water and Waste Water Treatment) SOLAR POWER GENERATION AND UTILIZATION: The rooftop of academic buildings, hostels and other buildings are free from shadow and solar PV panels are installed in first phase of 1.2 MWp (1200 KWp) capacity. The system is commissioned and synchronized with grid on last week of July, 2018. Up to 31st March, 2019 the total generation is

5,24,939 units. BIO GAS PRODUCTION FROM ORGANIC WASTE: The organic waste generated from different campuses are segregated and taken to the nearby bio gas plant for producing bio gas which is again utilized in the canteen as fuel. The processed waste after decomposed and bio gas extracted is discharged to a pit where it is taken as Organic manure. KIIT has installed the following capacities of bio gas plants at different locations i) 500 Kg / Day processing capacity X 06 nos. ii) 1000 Kg / Day processing capacity X 01 no. SOLAR THERMAL UTILITIES: For supplying hot water to bathrooms, KIIT has installed solar water heaters on roof tops. The total capacities of hot water systems in total is 96,000 ltrs / day. GROUND WATER RECHARGE FROM RAIN WATER (RECYCLED WATER AND WASTE WATER TREATMENT): The rain water collected on rooftop is channelized to recharge pits prepared as well defunct bore wells in different campuses to increase ground water level. Proper set up methods are adopted for quick percolation and water passage in the pits.

The following points summarize the key achievements of the University in this area 1) Received the prestigious tag of the 'Institution of Eminence' as declared by MHRD, Govt. of India in 2019. 2) University had been granted full Autonomy by the UGC in 2018. 3) The University was accredited by the NAAC (in 2016) in A grade (with a score of 3.48) for 5 years. 4) KIIT is also selected by the UGC in 2019 for implementing the 'Paramarsh' scheme wherein the Institute will be mentoring other Institutes and Colleges in the State of Odisha aspiring for NAAC accreditation. 5) Accreditation of Five UG Engineering Programmes has been extended and Three UG Engineering Programmes are accredited for the first time by the National Board of Accreditation (NBA India). 6) B. Tech Programs in Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering, Information Technology, Mechanical Engineering and Electrical Engineering are also accredited by The Institution of Engineering and Technology (The IET, UK) initially for 2015 to 2019 Cohorts. However, the accreditation for these programs has been extended to 2021 Cohorts after monitoring review conducted in 2019. 7) NIRF has ranked KIIT 31st in University Category, 30th under Management, 30th under Medical Category, 12th among Law Schools and 50th in Overall Categories. 8) KIIT has been placed in QSBRICS 2019 with a rank in the 291 to 300 bracket. 9) Last but not the least, the University has been featured in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings (WUR) as 1001 in Overall Category, 801 in Engineering and 601 in Computer Science. It is worth mentioning that the Institute has also been ranked as 301 in Impact Rankings 2019 by the Times Higher Education (THE) and Young University Ranking 2019.
